## From the Chairman

# **League Matches**

Having said that, it is sad to reflect that only five of the ten teams in the league were able to complete their full set of fixtures which I feel is disappointing. Therefore, the committee would like to see teams make a greater effort to get all matches played next season and where rearrangements need to happen, the league's rules (16.5) should be followed.

# **Team Handicap League**

The team handicap league final between Broadstone A and Branksome A was played on the  $24^{th}$  of April. After a very close match, Broadstone A came out as winners of the title 10 - 9.

Having reviewed the format we played this season, the committee has decided that as it has proved successful and provided teams with more matches, the same format will be used again next season with a few alterations, namely:

- To use the final league positions of the 2022/23 season to decide the teams in the A and B groups.
- To play the team handicap league matches at the end of the league season as previously but to send out the fixture list in good time for captains to arrange teams, hall bookings etc.
- The individual player's handicap will be based on the averages achieved at the end of the 2023/24 league programme.

The Drawn Doubles and Presentation Evening were held on the 26<sup>th</sup> of April and once again provided an enjoyable evening of closely fought games, a raffle and refreshments. It will help her immensely to organise the format of the event, groups etc. if she knows exactly how many players will be turning up.
